### NOTES FROM THE GALLERY

Wild, wacky and zany are just some of the adjectives to describe the annual Prefix 927 Art Show. And this non-traditional exhibit is returning! This annual event kicks off with a reception on Friday, Sept. 1, 5:30-7:00 p.m., at the CCA. The evening includes a wine bar, live music, refreshments and the presentation of awards.









This offbeat exhibit began several decades ago as a way to let local artists expand their creativity - hence the name 927, for Cambria's main phone prefix – but is now open to artists from all over. Formerly at the Veterans Memorial Building, the 927 Show now takes place at the CCA Gallery. The exhibit runs from August 31 through Sept. 24.



The 927 juror is Tim Roche, Cambria artist and instructor, and also past president of both Allied Arts and the San Luis Obispo County Arts Council. Tim studied at the Art Students League of New York, St. John's University and Cuesta College, and has earned art degrees in painting and sculpture. "Although classically trained," he said, "my techniques demonstrate a broad range of artistic expression that variously shows realism,

impressionism and expressionism. I work in all mediums of two- and three-dimensional design."

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### En Plein Air

I just returned from a six-day backpacking romp through the Colorado Rockies. Averaging 11,500 ft in elevation, six of us traversed 36 miles of the Colorado Trail between Silverton and Rico. Twice we rested at passes exceeding 12,500 ft. At that elevation, most of the range was seen at a bird's eye view. And of course, those with cameras were snapping away, hoping to capture the majesty that lay before us. As I gazed at the endless 360 view of valleys and mountain peaks draped in aspen and pine with pillowing clouds looming overhead, I became aware that no photograph can recreate this experience.

However, whether it is an amateur photographer hiking this trail or professional with all the skills and equipment, we try to get as close as we can to recreating the visual. Often the professional will alter or manipulate the lighting, hues, and density to create additional moods to the piece.

Unlike the photographer who starts with an exposure, the plein air painter, one whose subjects are found outside the studio, begins with a blank canvass, an easel, brushes, and palette of color media. The miracle is the transformation of a landscape subject to the canvass. And unlike photography, the visual and emotional interpretation is established as the piece is being created, anything from photorealism to impressionistic to abstract and everything in between.

So, if you are lucky enough to have a panoramic view of the Alps from your chalet, plein air art that touches your heart is the next best thing. But if you are able, you should backpack somewhere that is inaccessible by all vehicles and see for yourself. Hard work, yes, but worth every breath.


